It doesn't matter if shaped by hand or with the help of moulds, you can easily create the most beautiful flowers using this versatile material. But please remember you need a higher activation heat so DO NOT FORGET to wear your rubberized gloves! Adding lights by using LEDs creates a mind-blowing effect. You can fuse edges with a soldering iron, or use hot glue to join pieces.

This gorgeous butterfly was created in this way and it was painted using glass paint.

The body is made out of our Worbla's® Transpa Art, too!

First of all, the base was shaped by hand (and then to smooth out the body it was covered with another layer of Worbla's® Transpa Art.

Rivets are handy for connecting Worbla's® Transpa Art. You can also just sew WTA pieces together or seam several layers with Worbla's® Finest Art (WFA).

By the way: You can combine both materials in many different ways. E.g. to protect your work against impact damage, you can cover Worbla's® Transpa Art over a WFA piece and its decorations.

In addition, it will give you a shiny surface. If you create a weapon out of WFA you can use WTA for the clear and illuminated pieces. You can use for example spray paint, art metal foil sheets, foils that can be shaped by heat to add some brightness and color to your WTA work.
